In the grand American literary tradition of books like *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn* and *A River Runs Through It* comes **William Kent Krueger’s** masterpiece, *This Tender Land* (Atria Books, September 3, 2019, \$27).

Krueger’s first stand-alone novel since his 2013 bestselling, award winning *Ordinary Grace* tells the story of four children – orphans all – who embark on a bold and dangerous journey during the summer of 1932. They are fleeing a place of loss and cruelty—and a terrible crime that one of them committed. The means of their escape is a canoe which takes them down the Gilead River in Minnesota, on their way to the mighty Mississippi, in search of a possible home in St. Louis. The narrator, Odie, is a heroic little boy, a natural storyteller, full of mischief and bravado and spirit.

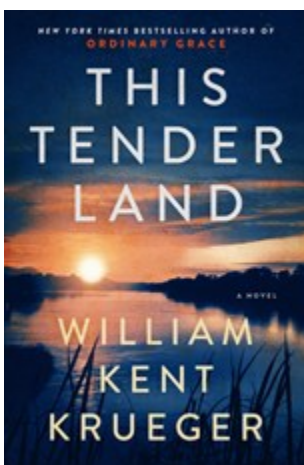
This is a big, satisfying, picaresque novel, full of unforgettable scenes and characters. Our four vagabonds are held captive by a farmer driven mad by the loss of his family; they fall under the spell of a traveling tent revival ministry led by a charismatic woman with a gift for healing; they encounter Hooverville shantytowns, people of all backgrounds and beliefs, and are tested in every way possible.

The book also explores an overlooked piece of American history – the Native American boarding schools that were a fixture around the United States until the 1960s. These were schools, rife with abuse and hardship, where Native American children were sent to live apart from their families and communities, forced to assimilate into white culture.

This Tender Land has many of the same qualities that readers loved about *Ordinary Grace* – honest storytelling prowess; a flawless recreation of an earlier time in America; an evocation of the natural landscape that will haunt your dreams; and a moral center that isn't cheap or easy but that feels infinitely true.

With this engrossing, big-hearted story, William Kent Krueger shines a new light on the dark days of the Great Depression, exploring themes that are relevant to the world we live in today.

William Kent Krueger is the acclaimed author of the *New York Times* bestselling *Ordinary Grace*, winner of the Edgar Award for best novel, as well as eighteen Cork O'Connor novels, including *Desolation Mountain* and *Sulfur Springs*.
